Research Trips and Tours

Day-long trips to area repositories and attractions have been arranged by Donna Holt Siemiatkoski, coordinator of numerous trips to area genealogical and historical sites, to enable participants to conduct research and learn more about their New England heritage. Special trip escorts will provide information on the bus and guidance at the site, and will be assisted by trained volunteers at each location.

Cost includes the bus, tip to the driver, snacks enroute, a guided tour of the facility, and research assistance on site. Admission fees for the Friday attractions are included in the price. Optional box lunches will be available for the Wednesday and Thursday tours only.

Land Platting and Deed Workshop

This optional workshop is scheduled for two sessions each day, with parts 1 & 2 on Friday, and parts 3 & 4 on Saturday.
