The New England Regional Genealogical Consortium, Inc. (NERGC) invites you to join us at our eighteenth conference *live and in-person only* at the DoubleTree hotel in Manchester, New Hampshire, October 29-November 1, 2025.



Manchester is a vibrant city with world-class entertainment at the Southern New Hampshire University Arena, one block from the host hotel. The mill district along the riverfront offers museums, relaxation at spas, and fine dining at well-known restaurants. Live music and nightlife are featured at Irish, Mexican, Asian, and American establishments an easy walk from the Conference hotel.

The Conference Committee is planning special tracks and other events on Wednesday, regular conference presentations on Thursday through Saturday, as well as the Exhibit Hall, Ancestors Research Consultants, Society Fair, and other events.

Registration for NERGC 2025 hasn't begun yet. The program and conference brochure are scheduled to be ready for distribution in early April (please give us the time to provide you with many details about the conference!) This is the same location as for several previous conferences but is perhaps a new name since your last visit. Join us there from October 29 through November 1 for the only regional genealogical conference in New England! The cost for the rooms during our stay is \$179.00 per night, beginning on Tuesday night, October 28 through Saturday November 1.

EXHIBIT HALL UPDATE

Applications for booths in the Exhibit Hall are now being accepted.

As in the past, our conferences are planned to be exhibitor friendly. The generous unopposed exhibitor time and close proximity to the sessions are among the reasons many vendors experience more success at a NERGC conference. We feature special benefits such as:

- Exhibit Hall open to the general public: Free access to the general public to be advertised for increased sales.
- **Optional:** Consider showcasing your booth by providing door prize drawings at your discretion. NERGC provides tickets to conference attendees in the conference registration packet.

We want to be sure you receive all the information needed.) If you have not exhibited with NERGC at any of our previous conferences and are interested, please be sure to send your organization's name and contact information so we can be sure to send you the details.

As with past conferences, there will be a limited number of booths, so it will be important to reserve your space early. Booth requests will be filled on a first-come basis. Although our registration process will not open until April, it will give those with special meal needs the option of summarizing your requests in writing as you purchase luncheon or banquet tickets in the online registration. Additionally, persons with mobility, hearing, or visual concerns may check a box matching the category of your need in



the online registration and briefly comment about what accommodation you might find helpful. A similar check option will be in our digital downloadable, printable, and manual fillable Registration and Payment Form in our distributed brochures. If you have mobility, hearing or visual needs, feel free to contact Pam Roberts at: accessibility-2025@nergc.org even before you register to inquire about the conference venue and hotel access for entering, parking, and how to request an accessible hotel room as well as community access from the hotels to the venue. She or an accessibility volunteer will work with you through your preferred phone or email to design an access plan to maximize your ability to enjoy your conference experience. To take full advantage of the accessibility options available, please register during the Early Bird registration period. We will try to meet your needs any time before or during the conference but may be limited in how we can help, especially if your request comes after May 1, 2025, five months before the event. Referral for equipment companies in the area will be coordinated for best rental fees. So, reach out with any questions you may have.
